Irene Brady lives in a home she built in the Oregon woods surrounded by wildlife – hawks, bobcats, cougars, hummingbirds, woodrats, deer, bears, jays and more – the subjects and inspiration for her many books and workshops.

Over a period of several years as an instructor of college-level Scientific Illustration at Southern Oregon University, Brady wrote and illustrated Illustrating Nature ~ Right-brain Art in a Left-brain World to use as

a textbook in her highly specialized classes. Excerpts from this textbook are now an integral part of her workshops.

Drawing and writing about animals and wildlife since childhood, Irene Brady began her first book, **America's Horses & Ponies**, at age nineteen. It was published by Houghton Mifflin five years later, and she never looked back (see **Publications** list at right). She recently completed **The Southern Swamp Explorer**, the second book of her Explorer nature series, which began with **The Redrock Canyon Explorer**.

Irene Brady's award-winning works lovingly unveil the marvelous complexity of nature, instilling and encouraging in her readers a respect and love for the earth.

She is currently engaged in teaching and developing workshops on Nature Sketching, Sketch/Journaling, Field Sketching for Naturalists, and variations on those themes throughout the United States and Costa Rica.

- interpretive displays and signs for government and public organizations, including: U.S. Forest Service reclamation sites, Redstone Arsenal Nature Trail, North Mountain Park Nature Center, Rookery Bay National Estuarine Reserve, and others.
- scientific illustrator and head of Graphics Unit at the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Forensics Lab, 1988-1992 doing: design, layout and production of lab logo, signage, brochures and visual displays in the laboratory; major displays for conferences and Washington D.C. offices; product design for containers, bumper stickers, etc.; media presentations for Fish & Wildlife officials; ID manuals and pamphlets for undercover agents; and courtroom displays and slide presentations for the Exxon Valdez prosecution and numerous other trials.
